MY HEART IS READY ... I WILL SING YOUR PRAISE

The last week on retreat with Bishop Peter and forty or so of the priests of the Diocese has been a great blessing: a time of rest and relaxation in good company and also a time of encounter with the Lord sacramentally, but also in the reading, mediations and contemplation of the Word of God, led by Fr. Richard, a wonderful scholar and man of insight and humour. We explored, in particular, the Letter to the Hebrews, and rediscovered the depths of this Scripture, which leads us to appreciate the glimpse of heaven, 'beyond the veil', with which we, as baptised Christians are blessed in so many ways in the daily practice and celebration of our faith. I only hope that I can pass on something of what I received during this week to you over the coming months in my preaching and in the living out of my ministry of service to you.

One particular joy was to be among so many of our younger priests (two in particular whose names I will not disclose) whose enthusiasm and zeal for the mission is so strong and vibrant. One of the Psalms that came up on more than one occasion goes as follows:

My heart is ready, O God, my heart is ready.
I will sing, I will sing your praise.
Awake my soul,
awake lyre and harp,
I will awake the dawn.

I will thank you Lord among the peoples, among the nations I will praise you for your love reaches to the heavens and your truth to the skies.'

As, together, we approach the Solemnity of Pentecost, let us all pray that we may recover that sense of excitement and zeal, that experience of the God's presence and call in our lives, so that on Pentecost Sunday those words of the psalmist may be ours too.



THE WORD OF GOD JOHN 14:23-29

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. Whoever does not love me does

not keep my words. And the word that you hear is not mine but the Father's who sent me. 'These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid. You heard me say to you, "I am going away, and I will come to you." If you loved me, you would have rejoiced, because I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you before it takes place, so that when it does take place you may believe.'

<u>Page 863</u> Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 Psalm 67 (66) Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

COMMENTARY

In these final discourses of Jesus at the Last Supper, as he sketches the outlines of his future Church, come four passages promising the coming of a Paraclete or Advocate, the Holy Spirit, 'Paraclete' and 'Advocate' mean the same: someone called to your side as a supporter, often in a legal situation. The Father will send this Paraclete, in the name and power of Jesus, so that the Paraclete will make Christ present in the Church, not physically but in a new way. The Paraclete will strengthen Jesus' disciples with Christ's own strength. The Paraclete will lead the disciples into all truth, so that they gradually come to a fuller understanding of all the implications of the teaching of Jesus. Like any legal advocate, the Paraclete will provide the followers of Jesus with power in teaching and argument to withstand opposition. This is the power which will guide the Church in ages to come, not only the official teachers of the Church, the successors of the apostles, but all the faithful who preserve and enrich the tradition of the Church by their prophetic office. The decree of Vatican II on the Church leaves no doubt that not only the call to sanctity but the prophetic office also extends to all the members of the Church, an inspiring and awesome responsibility.
